Sell Your Books at the Gold Country Fair

Members who want to sell their books at the Gold Country Fair on September 8-11 can contact Bill Baynes (**bbaynes303@aol.com**) before August 31st to reserve their space and to provide book titles. Authors can supply up to one dozen books total for all their titles. Books must be delivered to the Rose Room at Auburn City Hall on any Wednesday from 10 a.m. until noon up to September 7. They can be delivered to our booth at the fair on the afternoon of September 8.

Authors must provide pricing information for each title, including sales tax, rounded off to the nearest whole dollar amount. GCW volunteers will not make any sales (\$12.95, for example) that require coins for change. Gold Country Writers will pay each author for each book recorded as sold. At the end of the fair, we will return remaining copies to members. We are not responsible for missing copies.

Authors are responsible for obtaining their own sellers' permits and for making their own sales tax payments to the state.

Authors who want to sell their books are encouraged to donate a couple of shifts over the course of the fair to staff the GCW booth. GCW will have an outside booth on Armory Road. Fair hours are listed below. The booth must be manned each hour the fair is open. There will be a sign-up sheet at the regular Wednesday GCW meetings. You don't need a book to sell to volunteer. Vendors receive the following for admissions and parking: 8 one-day admission passes (one-time entrance), and 2 four-day parking passes.

Fair Hours:

September 8th, 4 p.m. – 11 p.m. September 9th, 4 p.m. – Midnight September 10th, 11 a.m. – Midnight September 11th, 11 a.m. – 10 p.m.

Placer Building and all indoor vendors close at 9 p.m. each night. This is a limited 4-day event with all vendor booths required to be open and staffed for all four days from open to close. Any vendor choosing to leave early, arrive late, or leave their booth unmanned during Fair hours will not be allowed back next year.
