Be questioning.


Listen carefully.





After years of pandemic and uncertain re-openings, millions of people have felt "tossed in time." With their social markers disrupted, what do they want to let go of or hold onto at this stage? Where can they find an anchor to regain their sense of place?

Tossed in Time: Steering by the Christian Seasons introduces people to the ancient Christian worship seasons – Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. It helps readers reshape their sense of time and find their place in a larger story. The book looks through the eyes of the apostle Peter, who dared to climb out of the boat during a storm and walk on the wild waves. In our own turbulent times, this book helps people explore a framework that infuses each day with meaning.


