Whatever metaphor you use for identifying your "truth": your "gut," your "bones," your "muse," listen to it carefully. Don't talk yourself out of it. You owe it to yourself and to your readers.





## **Create a Display Board for your Book**

As you plan for book sale opportunities or launch parties, a poster display board can

highlight what you want people to notice the most about your books. I created a Word document of text, plus separate files of the photos I wanted to insert. I made sure I had a legal right to use the photos (not violating copyright laws), by choosing pictures from **unsplash.com** or **pixabay.com**, or providing my own photographs.

I sent those to my local Staples store in both Word and PDF, and then went into the store in person to work out the order with them, sign and pay up front for it. If I had done this at least two weeks before I needed the posters, I could have had the local store send the posters to their Design Team (which would have allowed me to have borders on the posters, for instance, which makes a nicer finished look). However, because I needed the finished posters in just a few days, the Staples Print Department employee allowed me to type the text directly on their computer and place the photos where I wanted them. Once I had the text typed in, she graciously came over to tweak the placement according to my wishes. What a gift!

I chose 18" by 24" foam board for the posters, matte finished but then laminated, and ordered cardboard stand-up backings at the same time. That way the posters can stand on their own or be propped up flat on a window ledge.
