#### **Strategies for Writers of Fiction and Memoir**

We are pleased to welcome Sands Hall for a presentation to Gold Country Writers! On Wednesday, September 20, she will present "Overlapping Strategies in the Writing of Fiction and Memoir."

She says, "A story is a story, whether it's one we've imagined or one we've lived. And while there are differences in what may drive a writer of fiction and a writer of memoir to begin their projects, once we're writing, there are some very useful similarities."

Novelist and memoirist Sands Hall will outline aspects of craft useful to the fiction writer — including plot, character, point of view, and the use of scene — and will discuss how to apply those ideas effectively to memoir. Known for her respect for and emphasis on writer's craft, Sands says "this will be useful to writers no matter their chosen genre."

**Sands Hall** — author, professor, theatre artist, singer-songwriter — is the author of a novel, a book on the craft of writing, and most recently of the award-winning memoir, *Reclaiming My Decade Lost in Scientology* (Counterpoint Press); Blackstone Audio produced the audio book, read by the author. Other publications include prize-winning essays and stories. Her extensive theatre experience, as playwright, actor, and director, not only allows her to offer a unique perspective on writing, but also infuses her teaching. 

Their strategies range from word-of-mouth invitations to magazine ads. Pauline suggested sending an article to area magazines, then mentioning your published book. She has addressed nine clubs already. Nancy recommended using someone's home and offering a list of discussion questions and homemade snacks. She read and signed for Solo Friends,

and 75 people showed up! Bottom line: use various strategies, be prepared, and reread your book in case of detailed questions. Good advice from two great ladies.

GCW President Susan Korn opened the Guest Speaker Program with an introduction and overview of our organization. First-time guests learned about the Mentor Program and membership benefits, and old-timers were reminded of them. She distributed packets in bright yellow folders that included the Gold Country Writers History 2011 - 2016, a description of the Mentor Program, a list of Gold Country Writers benefits, and the Gold Country Writers Critique Guidelines.

She also introduced the Board Members and Committee Chairs to the group in attendance.

Exciting news! Literary events have been returning to public libraries after a hiatus (due to Covid). After recent visits to several libraries, I learned of these September events for poets and writers in Cameron Park, Placerville, and Folsom.

**Poets and Writers Workshop** led by El Dorado County Poet Laureate Emeritus Lara Gularte and author Beverly Parayno — held on the first Tuesday and third Thursday of every month. "We offer an encouraging space for writers and poets to gather in community. Bring one or two poems or six pages of prose, double-spaced. **Poetry Reading** — **California Poet Laureate Lee Herrick** will give a reading, host a Q&A, and sign books. He will be joined by El Dorado County Poet Laureate Stephen Meadows, along with two El Dorado County Poets Laureate Emeritus — Lara Gularte and Taylor Graham. The Poets Laureate will also give readings and sign books. Acoustic guitarist Peat Ryder of Ryder Thieves will provide musical accompaniment.




