# Tips for Building Author-Bookstore Relationships

We are pleased to welcome James L'Etoile back for a presentation to Gold Country Writers. On Wednesday, November 15, he will present "Building Author-Bookstore Relationships."

Every author wants to see their book displayed in a bookstore, or dreams about holding a real live author event. With so many book titles competing for space and attention at bookstores, the path to those goals is not easy. L'Etoile says, "There are simple strategies to establish and build relationships with your local bookstore and increase your chances of landing a spot on the shelf." He will share lessons learned — what works and what to avoid — for authors hoping to build a productive, mutually beneficial bookstore partnership. Also, he will also share tips for successful book launch events.

L'Etoile uses his twenty-nine years behind bars as an influence in his award-winning novels, short stories, and screenplays. He is a former associate warden in a maximum-security prison, a hostage negotiator, and Director of California's state parole system. *Black Label* earned the Silver Falchion for Best Book by an Attending Author at Killer Nashville, and he was nominated for the Bill Crider Award for short fiction. *Dead Drop* garnered a Lefty and an Anthony Award nomination.

He has held book events across the country, but considers Face In A Book Bookstore and Gifts in El Dorado Hills Town Center his second home. Just months ago, in August, he had a book launch at Face In A Book for *Devil Within*. On Saturday, November 18, he will have a book launch for his latest, *Face of Greed*. This special "tell-and-show" event series is not to be missed! After "telling" details on how authors can have mutually beneficial relationships with bookstores, James will be "showing" some of those techniques with his book launch event at Face In A Book

# Our Gratitude to Meera Ekkanath Klein

Gold Country Writers got an earful and a mouthful of information, anecdotes and recipes from author Meera Ekkanath Klein in October. She recommends adding food recipes and fables to your fiction to enrich it. She shared her fascinating upbringing and how it influenced her to become a writer. Her Hindu background included a long, sacred tradition of prayers with storytelling afterward. Meera drew on these fables to write her books. We can draw on our own recipes, fables and legends of our heritage for our writing.

Her first book, *My Mother's Kitchen*, helped her through the grief of losing her mother and won many awards including the National Indie Award, the Multicultural Award, the Next Generation Indie Award, Feathered Quill, and Best Romance. Her latest book is titled *Seeing Ceremony.* 

Meera added an interactive element to her presentation by passing out bags of herbs to all attendees. We had to guess which herb or spice we had, and then write about it. Many readers wowed the crowd with their evocative essays. A fragrant time was had by all!

During her "Food and Fables in Fiction Writing" presentation, October Speaker **Meera Ekkanath Klein** talked about awards she received for her novels with recipes — *My Mother's Kitchen* and *Seeing Ceremony*. Two of those awards were from the **2021 Next Generation Indie Book Awards** for *Seeing Ceremony* — "Grand Prize Winner (3rd Place)" in Fiction, and "Winner" in the Second Novel category. Meera added that they are now accepting entries for next year, the Awards are huge, and she gave a speech receiving her awards.

According to the website, the Next Generation Indie Book Awards is "the largest international awards program for indie authors and independent publishers." Entries are currently being accepted for books written in English and released in 2022, 2023 or 2024. Books must be received by February 14, 2024 to be entered into the 2024 Awards Year.
