Create Fiction From Your Lived Experience


We are pleased to welcome Beverly Parayno for a presentation to Gold Country Writers. On Wednesday, April 17, 2024, she will present "Drawing From Lived Experience To Write Fiction."

Are you interested in turning your real life experiences into story? For this workshop, Beverly says that we will look at several authors' works, including her own work, to discuss how they draw from their lives to create fiction. Then we will select a key event or time frame in our own lives as a jumping off point and use elements of fiction to illuminate the story.

Beverly Parayno is the author of the debut story collection *Wildflowers* (PAWA Press, 2023). Her fiction, memoir, essays, and author interviews appear in *Narrative Magazine*, *Bellingham Review*, *The Rumpus*, *Warscapes*, *Huizache*, and *Southward: New Writing from Ireland*. Her work has been translated into Mandarin and published by World Literature, a journal of the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences.

Raised in east San Jose by immigrant parents from the Philippines, Beverly earned a B.A. from San Jose State University, an M.A. from University College Cork, and an M.F.A. from Vermont College of Fine Arts, where she received a Lynda Hull scholarship. She serves on the board of Philippine American Writers and Artists, and the Munster Literature Centre in Cork, Ireland. In October 2023, she participated in and moderated panels at the Cork International Short Story Festival. In March 2024, as part of Storytelling Sunday, she participated in the International Working-Class StoryFest that took place online and in person — in Leicester, England and in Placerville, California. Additionally, she cofacilitates the Poets and Writers Workshop at the Cameron Park Library.

She works as a development professional and animal communicator. Currently, she is working on a teenage runaway memoir set in upstate New York in the mid-1980s. For more about Beverly, visit: wildflowersbp.com.



Scott Thomas Anderson's Crime Podcast

If you are drawn to crime stories and their outcomes, Scott Thomas Anderson's new podcast is right up your dark alley! Anderson shared his own personal story of how two serial killers affected his life. He took us for a ride of ups and downs as he related his experience of interviewing the people who were directly impacted by two serial killers who killed many people in Calaveras County. His new Documentary Crime Podcast, *A Trace of the Devastation*, consists of five chapters, each with a compelling title: The Unicorn Man, What Only the Owls See, Hunter's Moon, The Gravity of Hidden Graves, and Though

Taken in Darkness.

As an experienced journalist, Anderson interviewed a variety of people who were touched in some way by the crimes. This includes detectives, sheriffs, FBI agents, neighbors, witnesses, and the friends and families of the victims.

Anderson shared about the challenges of tracking down people impacted by the crimes and getting them to talk about their feelings and experiences related to them. His persistence paid off over the years. He succeeded in finding and interviewing many who were able to paint a harrowing picture of the shocking ripples sent through Calaveras County, neighboring Amador County, and the entire Bay Area.




