I personally want to thank all of you who participated in making this program a success. Since then, we have picked up two more mentees for our Program: one member in Auburn and one member who just joined in Citrus Heights. Congratulations and welcome, new mentees!

I was asked to be on Susan Ruston's Auburn Wave Television show to share and discuss Gold Country Writers. Susan made it fun and easy for me despite my second thoughts about participating. Two Inspiring Panels for August

Mentorship Program Panel

GCW President Susan Korn regaled Gold Country Writers with a thorough description of the Mentorship Program that she leads. Four panelists shared their wonderful experiences of GCW mentorship: Mary Mohs, Pat Snelling, Tzeli Triantafillou, and Kathryn Shields.

Mary had two mentors, Rebecca Inch-Partridge and Susan Korn, who helped her to organize her ideas. They met twice a month at Depoe Bay Coffee Roasters. The mentorship kept her writing and helped her get a publisher. An added benefit: they became friends.

Pat wrote a novel and knew it needed revision. Mentor Susan Korn gave her feedback, cared about her work, and helped her to see the readers' perspective. Susan also helped her to get it bound into a book.

Tzeli's mentor, Susan, helped her reconnect with her childhood dream of writing and her true self. She received good feedback with kindness. Susan helped Tzeli edit her writing so that the reader can understand it.

Kathryn's mentor had children's story skills, which fit perfectly with her genre. She recommended that we find a mentor with skills that we need.

Self-Publishers Panel

Michael O'Haver shared his experience of editing, formatting, printing, designing the cover, and publishing for himself. He's a do-it-yourselfer and learned a tremendous amount in this approach.

Kathryn Shields tried query letters and hybrid publishers, but eventually used fiverr.com to publish her children's book. On that website, she chose various functions and paid experts separately for editing, formatting, cover design, and illustrating. Her efforts resulted in a First Place Award from the International Indie Book Awards for *On The Point of a Star*.

Phyllis Kalbach created an independent publishing company to publish her book. Formatting was the most challenging work. Her Sci Fi novel, *Blue Eden*, earned notice from Hollywood and a phone call from former Vice President Al Gore.

Barbara Young self-published *The Heart That Rocks Health Care* to purchase her books at cost and own all the rights. Also, she didn't want to wait the typical two to three years to be published by a big house publisher. She wanted to preserve the tone and heart of her

writing, which can be compromised when working with a publisher.

Everyone gained valuable insights at the August two-panel presentation. Much appreciation to the panelists and all who participated!
