At the August Leadership Conference, we resolved the challenge of book launches, announcements and author book sales as it pertains to the GCW mission and policies. Here are the results.

Topic: How Should Gold Country Writers Support its Authors?

Leadership Breakout group: H. Kutchukov, L. Schliff, M. Yee Webb, N. Goldman, S. Osborn.

Proposed Resolution: GCW supports its *authors' book launches and their book-related awards and **events in the following ways:

1. Distribute announcements in the Dispatch and website, and announce at club meetings.
2. Invite authors to bring flyers and handouts regarding their book launch or event to place on the table by the door in an Informational Rack for display.
3. A "Members' Events" bulletin board will be placed on the table by the door where authors can bring and post a flyer about a book launch, award or event. Thank you, Barbara Young, GCW Internal Vice President for doing this.
4. Celebrate authors annually. We might have the Winter Holiday event as an opportunity for all authors to display up to 3 of their book titles. If properly licensed, authors may sell their works. At this party, GCW will announce all published works and awards within the past twelve months.

Thanks to Nicolle Goldman for her excellent report on this issue.

Topic: Announcements

Proposed Resolution: Make it clear that GCW is announcing, not sponsoring, book launches and events.

1. All announcements at club meetings should be brief and made by ONE announcer.
2. The announcer would be Communications Director, VP – Internal if present, or Membership Director).
3. All announcements must be submitted to the announcer before the start of the meeting.
4. A standard format might be, "[*Author*] is having a [*book-related event*] on [*date*] at [*location*]. For details, see the flyer on the table by the door."
5. We will need someone to coordinate the December "Author Celebration" party. (Will need to create announcements for newsletter, website, and email blast.)

These ways are in ADDITION to other existing practices such as the Lending Library, Read & Review meetings, and annual brochures of GCW authors' publications.

Definitions:

* **Authors** means GCW members in good standing with a published work (includes self-published, new, and existing publications.)

** **Events** refers to authors' events directly related to their published work, such as book signings, TV, or radio appearances.

I would personally like to thank the problem resolution group of leaders who provided fair and equitable statements and a great report on book launches and announcements.

Let's all enjoy the fall season before the holidays arrive next month.

As a book editor and author platform coach, Joey Garcia helps writers get known while they're writing a book, so when it's published, there's an audience waiting to read it. Her clients have been interviewed by, or have bylines in, The Wall Street Journal, Smithsonian magazine, Ms. magazine, CNN, and The Tamron Hall Show, among others. Joey is the author of *When Your Heart Breaks, It's Opening to Love* and has been a featured Relationship Expert in HuffPost, USA Today, Deutsche Welle, KVIE public TV, Global Woman TV Sweden, Australia's Ticker News and Slate's Dear Prudence podcast. Her poetry, short stories, and essays have received awards from, or been published in, Calyx, Mslexia, Hippocampus creative nonfiction magazine, Writer's Digest, The Brevity blog, The Caribbean Writer, and Hypertext. In 2017, Joey established the first-ever literary fellowship in Belize, her birthplace. A professional speaker, she has wowed audiences in the U.S., Sweden, and Albania.

A frequent presenter at the San Francisco Writers Conference, Joey has given presentations and master classes, and has been featured as one of the experts in the Ask-a-Pro sessions. Her presentation topics have included:

EJ Brun Gives Us Believability

Many thanks to our September Guest Speaker EJ Brun, who gave us much to believe in. She is a professional animator turned author. Inspired by her background, she developed twelve principles of believability that will engage the reader, create reader logic to immerse them in the story, and trigger the reader's imagination. She points out that

realism is not that different from believability.

Brun tells us that stories are a form of communication, a kind of handshake. Believability is part of that. Through words, the author gets the reader to commit to the story and that world. Words have power if you choose them carefully.

Here are some of those principles: Successful settings, consistency of the physical world and internal journeys, proper contextualized history, cause and effect (why did it happen), and contradictions, which exist in real life as well.

Brun recommends a subplot that reinforces the main plot and its believability. Interruptions and conflicts can tie in to elevate your narrative. For example, in the story of Romeo and Juliet, the feud between the Montagues and Capulets is a subplot to the love story, and they connect.
