Many Thanks to Dänna Wilberg

Gold Country Writers welcomed Dänna Wilberg to the Rose Room for a presentation to in November. She shared her experience and knowledge about writing a script. This can be helpful for enhancing a writer's novel and creativity in many ways.

Script writing, according to Wilberg, enhances versatility and storytelling prowess. In turn, these skills can enhance your other skills. Many valuable tools come with script writing and producing a film. She encourages us to try it and keep trying, as you'll learn so much no

matter the outcome.

One example is in pacing. A film script must move fast to produce a good visual result. Your novel can acquire tighter pacing, making stories more gripping and page-turning.

She showed us the trailer from a script she wrote about three women with telekinetic powers, "The Push". Each character in the film has a conflict. You get to see your words spoken and acted out by somebody else. Inner conflict expressed on their faces and their body language can be transferred into novel writing.

Script writing is designed to create immediate impact which can breathe life into your novel writing. It hones your ability to think visually. Wilberg rolled out another film trailer about a woman who hates Christmas. There is a flashback scene at the beginning, but Wilberg cautioned us about too many flashbacks. They have to flow so you don't lose the audience. A third trailer, "The Story", shows the angst on the character's face. Internal conflict is conveyed through facial expressions rather than dialogue. This can help the novel writer to convey what the character is feeling in a different way. There are more tools to work with in script writing and film-making.

Through script writing, the novel writer can attain a more nuanced understanding of his or her characters. Script writing encourages a deep exploration of the characters' inner thoughts and emotions.

Thanks and appreciation to Dänna Wilberg for sharing her expertise in script writing and film producing. Maybe one of GCW's members will produce a film in the future!


McHenry gives readers a fascinating peek into the world of a park ranger with humor and wit, about the pains and joys of her job.
