Donna Levin "DIALOGUE: the rules, the revelations, and the room to experiment"

Have you ever skimmed a long passage of description so as to reach the next line of dialogue? Dialogue is the most immediate element of fiction; it's when the author completely disappears and the reader only hears the characters talking. And dialogue can accomplish so much, revealing not just the characters' personalities, but their backgrounds, and, perhaps most importantly, what they want. Dialogue can even further the story, if done right. When not done right, dialogue can be stilted, unrealistic, or expository. Donna Levin will talk about how to avoid these traps, and share techniques for creating effective and entertaining conversation. Donna is the author of two books on the craft of writing: Get That Novel Started and Get That Novel Written; and of five acclaimed novels, including The Talking Stick. Green Gilded Gals Garner Gaggles of Giggles

Our speaker meeting this month was far from word salad, as Susan M. Osborn and Sarah M. Pressler treated us to their program, "Lettuce Laugh: Adding Humor to Your Writing". Humor is a highly beneficial thing, both in our stories and in our lives. Levity can come at any point in any genre, and is an element already present in a lot of works. One of the key ideas for implementing humor intentionally and successfully is to be considerate of one's words. Swapping regular words for sillier substitutes, employing a playful rhyme, and weaving in coincidences are simple and effective ways to be more intentional with giving our writing a funny flair. Pacing, understatement, surprise, wordplay, dialogue and basing humor on character are also methods intrinsic to the written form that can make or break a funny moment.

The workshop exercise in using funny words had us finagling and razzle-dazzling, and left us flabbergasted at looney malarkey. We tried our hands at crafting limericks. This led us to spin tales of old ladies in lavatories, flustered rabbis, and all sorts of oodly doodly doff to a chorus of "da-da, da-da, da-da." We employed tools of surprise, wordplay, exaggeration, anecdote, onomatopoeia and alliteration.

Susan Osborn remarked that she has "never been disappointed in the talent in this room", which is something we can all agree with wholeheartedly. She and Sarah shared an incredible amount of skill, passion, and enthusiasm. This is what makes this organization the truly wonderful community it is. Kudos to them, kudos to us!


