

# GOLD COUNTRY WRITERS Nonfiction Short Story Contest Rules

#### ELIGIBLITY

- Contest open to Gold Country Writers members and to non-member residents of El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, or Yuba counties.
- Short story must be nonfiction, unpublished, with word count less than 1,500 words (as shown in Microsoft Word, not including the title)
- No fiction, poetry, essays, opinion pieces, violence, sex, racism, politics, religious doctrine, or AI-generated stories.
- One submission per entrant. Must be 18 or older.

#### WHEN TO SUBMIT

Contest opens August 6, 2025, and closes on midnight on September 17, 2025.

#### FORMAT

- Times New Roman font, 12-point, with double-spaced lines and 1-inch margins.
- Title centered at top of each page, and page number centered at bottom.
- Author's name and identifying information must not appear anywhere in the story.
- · Story must be a single Microsoft Word or Adobe Acrobat file.

#### HOW TO SUBMIT

- Entries will only be accepted through the Gold Country Writers website at https://goldcountrywriters.com/short-story-contest-entry-form-2025/
- Entry fees are not refundable, \$15 for Public and \$10 for Gold Country Writers members, payable online using PayPal at <a href="https://goldcountrywriters.com/entry-fee/">https://goldcountrywriters.com/entry-fee/</a>
- If unable to pay online, fee may be paid by check at a Gold Country Writers meeting or mailed to P.O. Box 5991, Auburn, CA 95604.
- · Story and entry fee must BOTH be submitted before contest closes. No revisions.

#### FINAL WORD

- The Judging Rubric Overview is available on the Gold Country Writers website at https://goldcountrywriters.com/short-story-contest-judging-rubric-overview
- You agree that if you should win, your story may be printed in the Gold Country Media family of newspapers, the Gold Country Writers Anthology, and in the Gold Country Writers newsletter (The Dispatch).
- Contest Celebration—where winners' stories will be read aloud—will be held Saturday, October 4, at Auburn City Hall and will be recorded by ACTV Auburn Community Television.

# July Speaker - Jennifer K. Morita

Jennifer K. Morita spoke on the topic "Querying A to Q — Pitching to Literary Agents." A former newspaper reporter, Jennifer K. Morita is the author of *Ghosts of Waikiki* released by Crooked Lane Books in November 2024. Her debut novel won the Lefty Award for Best Debut Mystery Novel in 2025 and was nominated for an Agatha Award for Best First Novel. Jennifer is a past president of Capitol Crimes, her local Sisters in Crime chapter, and also a member of Crime Writers of Color, Mystery Writers of America, and International Thriller Writers.



Jennifer presented an informative how-to lesson which covered the basics of querying literary agents, including helpful tips for writing the dreaded synopsis. She explained how to craft the perfect "elevator pitch" for your book, and she emphasized the importance of doing your research when finding an agent who fits your needs. Jennifer also provided a highly detailed template for formatting a concise yet effective query letter that will grab an agent's attention. She reminded us that the ultimate objective of any query letter is to make the agent want to request your full manuscript.

Jennifer shared the new trends in querying for the 21st century, including Twitter and Bluesky contests, as well as the importance of having a social media presence, including an author website, before you start querying.

# Thanks For the Memories!

At our July 2 meeting, Susan Korn gave an impactful and heartfelt speech reflecting on her time as both a member and President of GCW. In case you missed it, please take a moment to read her words below.

I recognize and thank the existing Executive officers and Board of Directors, and others of our leadership team. It has been a privilege and an honor to serve as a second time as President of GCW.

I think for me the most valuable aspect of GCW is the friendships that I have made along the way. Many of these friendships will continue to thrive and become



life-long. You are my Gold Nuggets. There are too many of you to name but you know who you are.

Second, would be the learning opportunities and that my writing skills have improved. I'm looking forward, God willing, to writing three more books in the coming years. As I step down from my role as President, I also see it as the end of a long career of being a Leader. I have served GCW to the best of my ability for the past 13 years. I have watch it grow from Grass Roots of eight folks to a beautiful successful non-profit

organization with 80 plus strong members who are intelligent, respectful, and have a passion for writing.

Four years ago, we had no funds and feared we were going broke in a few months. We held a Leadership meeting and solved the problem. Today, we have over \$6000 in our savings funds. We have an Educational Speakers program which is excellent with high attendance every third Wednesday, and Critiques Groups who meet and have won Community book writing awards for their creative content. We are a proud group who must care enough about GCW to see that it never weakens.

It is joyous today that we are a winning team because of the members of leadership who come every single Wednesday to make decisions that keep us successful. Remember the 80-plus members that you represent and why you were you elected.

My hope for GCW was always that anyone who was interested in Storytelling, Poetry, or writing their first book would be welcomed and acknowledged. We have achieved this success as being a kind and welcoming non-profit book writing organization. It is that hope that GCW will always welcome the writer who wants to improve their writing, and that others who are far more advance in the skills of writing will be compassionate and patience with those who may need a little more assistance, and encouragement.

I would like to share a statement from one of my personal heroes, Vince Lombardi. He defined American values such as sacrifice, self-discipline, teamwork, and perseverance, likening it to life and war, in its demands for hard work and resilience. He highlighted the importance of leadership, defining it as a blend of commitment, loyalty, mental toughness, and character, which are developed through effort rather than innate talent. Lombardi concluded by asserting that leadership requires sacrifice, self-denial, love, fearlessness, and humility, which distinguish great leaders from ordinary ones. So as I end, I want to say how much I enjoyed knowing all of you, and how much I love our parties and celebrations. Thanks for the memories!


### Read and Review is our very own GCW book club


