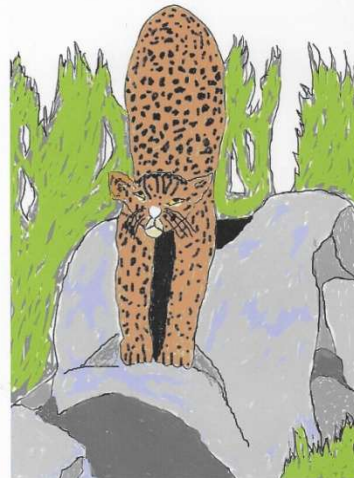

Joanne Butterfield's Writer's Workshop

On Wednesday, September 21, 2016, Joanne Butterfield addressed Gold Country Writers on the topic "Sharpen Your Writing Skills."

Joanne stressed that above all, writing is an art, and that we should look at every word we write as an expression of that art. Writing is also: hard work, tedious, lonely, rewarding, joyful, time-consuming, infectious, humor at its best, and serious drama.

Ten things are necessary for sharpening writing skills:

- Sleeping to clarify the mind
- Spending time alone
- Spending time with other writers
- Attending book signings and open-mic events
- Keeping a journal (which can be done on tape as well as in writing)
- Taking classes to keep up-to-date on style changes, what is out there, etc.
- Writing in different genres, being willing to step out of your comfort zone
- Figuring out what writing plan (deadline-setting, procrastinating, goal-setting) works best for you
- Writing, writing, writing, reading, reading, reading, and
- Revising, revising, revising.

Following the presentation, Joanne guided the group through two writing exercises, first in responding to Edward Bulwer-Lytton's famous opening line, "It was a dark and stormy night," and then in using greeting cards to stimulate responses.

Joanne leads a writing and critique group that meets at 6:30 p.m. on the first and third Tuesdays of the month at the Centerpoint Community Church, 515 Sunrise Ave., Roseville, CA . The public is welcome to attend.
